# What Happened?

On December 6, 2023, a gunman opened fire on the campus of the University of Nevada Las Vegas, killing three faculty members and wounding another before being shot dead by police.



## Timeline of Events

- At 11:45 a.m., reports of shots fired sent police swarming onto the campus while students and professors barricaded themselves inside classrooms and dorm rooms.
- Students and faculty were quickly alarmed by texts and social media messages urging them to "RUN-HIDE-FIGHT."
- Police said the shooting started on the fourth floor of the building that houses UNLV's Lee Business School. The gunman went to several floors before he was killed in a shootout with two university detectives outside the building.

## Timeline of Events

- Authorities gave the "all clear" about 40 minutes after the initial report of an active shooter.
- Las Vegas Metro and UNLV police, in coordination with the FBI, spent the remainder of the day, up until almost 8 p.m. sweeping and evacuating each of the buildings on the university campus.
- Three other people were transported to a local hospital due to anxiety attacks; two police officers were injured during the building sweeps.





## What We Know Now?

- The shooter was identified as 67-year-old Anthony Polito, a former college professor who taught school at East Carolina University in North Carolina and who resided in Henderson, NV.
- Police say Polito had tried to get a job at UNLV but was rejected.
- Polito allegedly had a list of targets at the school and more than 150 rounds of ammunition.
- He was also later found to have mailed 22 letters of an unidentified white powder to other faculty members at schools around the country.

#### The Media

- Every major news organization along with state and local news carried coverage of the shooting and subsequent updates in real-time.
- NBC News was among those who interrupted programming to deliver the initial report.





### The Police



#BREAKING We are responding to preliminary reports of an #ActiveShooter on the campus of UNLV near BEAM Hall. There appears to be multiple victims at this time. Please avoid the area and we will have more information soon.



- At 1:52 Pacific time (2 hours, 7 minutes after the shooting was reported), Las Vegas Sheriff Kevin McMahill held his first briefing with reporters near the campus.
- McMahill essentially told residents the threat was over and that victims were being transported.




### The Chase

#### What to know about the UNLV shooting


- The suspect in the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, shooting, which killed at least three people, is a man in his 60s, three law enforcement sources familiar with the investigation told NBC News. There was no immediate information about a motive.
- At least three people were killed, police said. A fourth person is in critical condition at a hospital.
- Police said the suspect has been located and is dead.

- In all the media coverage, NBC News appeared to have someone on the inside of the investigation. They continuously reported new information before anyone else.
- In some cases, Las Vegas Metro then responded by confirming that news.


## **News Conference**

- Police scheduled a news conference for 5 p.m. local time (6 hours after shooting/3 hours after initial briefing).
- During the conference, the Las Vegas Sheriff, Governor Joe Lombardo and the UNLV Director of Security spoke.
- No new updates were provided; instead, law enforcement used the opportunity to herald cooperation of responders.





### Rumors and Misinformation

Rumors and misinformation about the shooting were posted almost immediately following the shooting.

- A post on X (formerly Twitter) by a user who goes by the name Dr. Jeremiah Emmanuel posted a clip from an earlier news broadcast and claimed there was an "FBI coverup incoming."
- The message was reposted by more than 600 users and gained more than 1,500 likes despite the account having 839 followers.
- But 790,000 people had seen it by Wednesday night, and it
  pushed any legitimate news updates further down in the tags —
  making it harder for people seeking information from official
  accounts used by the university and law enforcement.



## Rumors and Misinformation

- The number of casualties and shooters became so exaggerated that a Metro Police officer working a safety shelter at University Church Las Vegas told the assembled students to wait for updates from law enforcement.
- The officer stressed to not rely on what was being reported on social media, where inaccurate accounts indicated there were multiple shooters and that fatalities were in the double digits.

### Rumors and Misinformation

- In a post with "#BREAKING" and "#URGENT," one account reposted a video of police and SWAT cars racing down the street near UNLV with the caption, "WOW..... Per scanner reports, 28 people shot at UNLV (Las Vegas) in campus shooting. The campus is still on lockdown."
- It gained 733 reposts, 866 likes and had nearly 500,000 views by Wednesday night. The post was made around 1 p.m. Wednesday by Brian's Breaking News and Intel, a blue-check-marked account that claimed to have worked at a company called Royal Intel.


